WHO WAS SAINT PATRICK?: Patrick was born in Roman Britain in 385 AD to a Roman official. His birth name was Maewyn. When he was 16 years old, he was captured, kidnapped, and carried to Ireland, where he was sold into slavery. He later escaped to Gaul (France) and converted to Christianity. While there, Patrick had a vision in which the Irish people begged him to return and minister to them. Patrick returned to Ireland as a missionary in 432 AD, spending the last 30 years of his life there, baptizing the people there and founding churches. The influence of Patrick in Ireland caused the pagan nation to fully convert to Christianity within 200 years and was the only county in Europe to Christianize peacefully, ending slavery, human sacrifice, and intertribal warfare associated with their pagan practices. Over the centuries debate continues as if Patrick was Catholic or not, my personal opinion from historical study being that he evangelized the area for Christ but after his death was claimed by the Catholic church as a patron saint of Ireland once the church got a foothold in the area. Either way one looks at it, one of the best books to read on the subject is How the Irish Saved Civilization by Thomas Cahill. In this book, it is claimed and noted that Patrick's influence extended far beyond Ireland. In a time when the Roman Empire came crashing down, issuing the Western world into the Dark Ages, Patrick's conversion of Ireland allowed Western learning to survive the Dark Ages, for the monasteries there copied and preserved classical texts, later returning this knowledge to a crumbled Europe paving the way for the Renaissance and Reformation, in effect "saving" civilization. St. Patrick's Day as a holiday really wasn't celebrated like it is today until the Irish emigrated to the United States, for the celebrations became a way for the Irish to connect with their roots after they moved to America. The tragedy in all this is that a holiday honoring a man for evangelizing a country for Christ has turned first into a tradition by the church and then over time into just another "holiday" for some Americans to get out and drink and party. Regardless of how a person views Patrick, the influence of the man changed a country, which would change the Western world, which would influence American culture today. The lesson in all this is that we should never underestimate the power of influence in which we have for Christ in our community and in our world. The cause of Christ will go on, He just chooses to use us. That I am thankful for as I reflect on this man's life.

SAINT PATRICK'S BREASTPLATE: St. Patrick's Breastplate is a popular prayer attributed to one of Ireland's most beloved patron saints. According to tradition, St. Patrick wrote it in 433 A.D. for divine protection before successfully converting the Irish King Leoghaire and his subjects from paganism to Christianity. I came across this prayer recently, and the words of it are so true and so inspiring, I thought I'd pass it along...

I arise today...Through a mighty strength, the invocation of the Trinity, Through belief in the Threeness, Through confession of the Oneness of the Creator of creation.

I arise today...Through the strength of Christ's birth with His baptism, Through the strength of His crucifixion with His burial, Through the strength of His resurrection with His ascension, Through the strength of His descent for the judgment of doom.

I arise today...Through the strength of the love of cherubim, In the obedience of angels, In the service of archangels, In the hope of resurrection to meet with reward, In the prayers of patriarchs, In the predictions of prophets, In the preaching of apostles, In the faith of confessors, In the innocence of holy virgins, In the deeds of righteous men.

I arise today, through...The strength of heaven, The light of the sun, The radiance of the moon, The splendor of fire, The speed of lightning, The swiftness of wind, The depth of the sea, The stability of the earth, The firmness of rock.
